

WS Tournament Director Tom Prendergast will serve as the tournament director. And since the tournament will be held during MLB Spring Training, every player will receive a ticket to a Major League Spring Training Game.


Three age divisions will be included in next year's inaugural event (28+ / 38+ / 48+) and every team will be guaranteed at least three games. Diary of an Aging Baseball Player

Phoenix Forecast—Sunny and 80 (Part II) Skies Partly Cloudy with Baseballs

The year is 1967, and I'm a freshman at Knox College in Galesburg, Illinois. I had only played summer baseball up to this point. My high school didn't have a team.

"Spring baseball" starts in January in Illinois, during a time when most clear-thinking college students (and even the drug-wired hippies of the 60's) would agree there is nothing remotely spring about January. Single digit temperatures and below zero wind chills make an afternoon in the chem lab more appealing than batting practice on the diamond.

But Coach Swise was no sadist. We didn't have to go outside in the sub-zero cold. We worked out indoors---on the gym floor. We didn't have nets so we couldn't hit. We could only do two things—work on rundowns, pickoffs and leadoffs, and take groundballs. Have you ever spent an hour and a half a day working on rundowns, pickoffs, and leadoffs? If you have, you'll know the sorry ending to my story. We worked on them several hours a week for several weeks. Then when we played our first game, we promptly nailed our first picked-off runner in the back of the helmet with the second

The groundballs. They provided another adventure. We took those groundballs off the hardwood. If you haven't had the pleasure let me tell you, the ball doesn't bounce the same as it does on dirt and grass or even artificial turf. So because you couldn't really learn to play a hop off the hardwood, about all you could do was learn to get in front of the ball. So Coach Swise would line us up in front of the folded up bleachers and fire us ground balls from about 30 feet, where you didn't have the time to not get in front of the ball. I think the only thing this did was test our manhood. However, we took enough of those shots off of various below-the-waist body parts, we began to wonder if we would have any of our manhood left.

Yet that gymnasium version of facing a firing squad was actually an improvement over the alternative—going outside. Like I said Coach Swise was no sadist. He applied a very generous rule. If the temperature was below 32 degrees (freezing for those of you who have gone metric), we stayed indoors. Above 32, we went outside.

I'm sure we looked very spiffy in our baseball regalia—sweats and a stocking cap (and no place to put the flip-down shades). For those of you playing in the 48 and older divisions, you might also recall batting gloves hadn't been invented yet. However, one enterprising freshman did show up for batting practice one day sporting leather dress gloves with rabbit fur lining. We macho upperclassmen mocked him until he took them off. To show I have grown wiser in my old age, I think now I should have asked to borrow them. I think that incident also explains why, to this day, I refuse to put on a pair of batting gloves.

Metal bats with squishy rubber grips hadn't been invented either. Who could ever forget the joy of getting jammed with an 85 mile-per-hour fastball and having your hands sting into the next day's English Comp exam. That #2 pencil looked way too much like a baseball bat in my hand. I took out my Bic.

I soon realized the reason we practiced in 32-degree weather was because we often had to play in 32-degree weather. Actually *playing* in that temperature wasn't the problem. Not playing was. No one at Knox ever carried the moniker of "benchwarmer." You couldn't have warmed those metal, open-air benches even if the college ran ductwork from the nearby pottery kiln. But this experience did help me in the next stage of my

In tomorrow's edition I will explain how Knox and Galesburg just were not cold enough for me. I headed north.

When Not Behind the Camera, Denevi-Jones Team Saves Lives

You know, it's said that when you look out onto a baseball diamond, you're not just watching two teams, but rather three—home, away, and the team of umpires working the game. Well, here at the 2002 MABL / MSBL World Series, you might notice a fourth team: the photography team of Denevi-Jones, here for the eleventh straight year shooting all the tournament action.

But when Chris Denevi and CJ Jones aren't spending their time lugging around cameras, lenses, and film, they're doing something much more important—saving the lives of newborn infants. Both work a night shift at Kaiser Hospitals in the Bay Area of California—Denevi is a RN, Jones a RT (Respiratory Therapist). And if a high risk pregnancy happens to come in between 11 pm and 7 am, you can be sure Chris and CJ will be prepared to step in, should the need arise.

"With a high risk pregnancy, like a premature birth, we're usually in the delivery room, just in case," Denevi explains. "If the baby doesn't breathe after birth, we resuscitate him and get him ready for the Intensive Care Nursery."

Babies born anywhere less than 35 weeks of pregnancy that have trouble breathing go to the IC Nursery for observation and can stay up to three or four months, depending on their condition. Denevi says that there are any number of reasons a baby might not breathe at birth.

"They might be in shock...they might have had the cord wrapped around their neck...or in preemies, it might be that their nervous system just hasn't developed enough to allow the brain to tell the right muscles what to do," she describes. "Typically, we stimulate the baby by rubbing his body, tube him, and breathe for him. A lot of the time, he'll get the idea on his own."

Denevi was originally a science and math teacher before deciding to go into nursing.

"I kept comparing paychecks to my roommate at the time, who was a nurse. I was a teacher, and her paycheck seemed a lot bigger than mine. And I thought to myself, I know all this stuff, after all I teach science. I could do this."

A short college curriculum later and Chris found herself at Kaiser specializing in saving babies' lives. That's where she hooked up with CJ.

Jones' career began as an Army medic. After her original three year enlistment, she re-upped and the Army trained her as a RT and she was posted near San Francisco. When her second tour was up, a civilian contact she made while in the service helped set her up at Kaiser, where she's been ever since.

"I pretty much span the gamut," she says. "I'll work with anywhere from 24 week neo-natal infants to the elderly nursing care patient. But most nights, I'm with Chris dealing with the high risk births."

Having the same shift at the hospital led Denevi and Jones together down a path that eventually would take them behind a viewfinder and shutter. Denevi had been a photo-buff since childhood, and when she heard Jones talking about how much she loved taking pictures, she couldn't resist encouraging her.

"I'd always felt I had an eye for it," says Jones. "You know, seeing a good picture composition just by looking at a scene. But I'd never taken any classes or anything. But Chris said I should just dive right in. I did, and I'm loving it."

In now their eleventh year as WS photographers, Denevi-Jones takes as many as 30 or 40 rolls of film a day during the three week tournament.

"One of the Bay Area teams saw some pictures I'd took of the Giants," said Denevi. "He wanted me to do the same thing at this men's baseball league he

played for. Eventually, that led to our traveling to Phoenix for the World Series tournament, just to photograph the Bay Area team. That year, (tournament director) Kurt Knop got to talking to us, and we've been coming down ever since."

And what about the problem of taking three weeks off in a row at the hospital?

"We've got lots of seniority by now," says Jones.

"We can pretty much write our own hours," adds Denevi.

What about the ones who have to fill in for you while you're gone?

Jones smiles.

"Just make 'em breathe until they learn how to do it for themselves."
