The weather man on channel 10 say's that relief is on the way, so not to worry. Hopefully he'll be right and the temperatures will drop into the 90's.

On the field the three new MSBL WS divisions make their debut today as the 38+ and 48+ wood divisions begin play. Each team will play 5 games in three days, using only wood bats, no composites allowed. Also new this year the 65+ and over division. Five teams will also play a five game schedule in three days. Last night the 65+ managers voted to play 7 inning games today as opposed to 9 inning games. They agreed to return to 9 innings on Thursday and Friday. The annual MSBL Trade Show opens at Tempe Diablo Stadium on Thursday and continues through Sunday.

Diary of an Aging Baseball Player


