DENEVI & JONES HEADING TO WS HALL OF FAME

HardBall photographers since 1992, Chris Denevi and CJ Jones will be inducted into the MSBL/MABL World Series Hall of Fame this month. For both of them, photography is a second profession. Ms. Denevi is a nurse and Ms. Jones is a respiratory therapist. But the MSBL World Series is the central event of their annual professional calendar.

In 1991, Denevi and Jones attended their first MSBL World Series. As luck would have it, one of the Bay Area teams did very well in competition and Denevi and Jones wound up taking pictures of the 30+ American championship game. At the time HardBall Magazine had used various photographers to cover the MSBL World Series, but as it became ever larger and more complex, the HardBall staff realized that they needed a very special kind of photographic team. They had to be able to take good action pictures, of course. But there was more to it.

HardBall Magazine (along with the WS Daily News) needed photographers willing to keep close track of who was in each frame, to grab rosters from team managers before games and spend long hours labeling the pictures after they were developed.

By pure coincidence, Chris and CJ were staying at the same hotel that Dan and Jackie Piro were staying during the tournament. Jackie was impressed with their work and more importantly their record-keeping system. Very impressed, she made arrangements to use them in 1992. (continued on page 2 see Denevi)

LI Mets And San Antonio Bombers Off To A Fast In 38+ National Division 38+ / 48+ Wood National And American, Plus The 65+ Division Begins Play Today By Tom Prendergast

Week two of the 2004 MSBL World series kicked off in high gear under perfect skies Monday with teams in the 28+ Central, 28+ Federal and the 38+ National jockeying for early leads in their divisions. 38+ National Bristol Baseball Club started with a solid 10-4 win at Tempe Diablo Stadium, but dropped their second game and closed opening day 1-1. The Long Island Mets toughed out a 2-0 win record for the day with 16-15 and 11-10 victories in the 38+ National. San Antonio beat San Jose 7-5 and shutout Sacramento 6-0. There were also several high scoring games across the divisions with double digit runs ranging from the high teens to a high 27 runs in one instance. Fifty-eight games were played throughout the valley to completion with players and umpires overcoming rough traffic conditions as a result of road construction across the metro. More than 14 teams start today's play at 2-0 and high expectations in the three divisions with the remaining teams looking for wins. The ping of aluminum gives way to the more traditional crack of the bat as the wood bat divisions of 38+ American & National and 48+ American & National start play today with sixty-three scheduled games. The 65+ Wood Division will be opening with six teams playing 15 regular series games.



The MSBL National office has announced the 2005 National Tournament schedule. The year's first tournament will be held at Disney's Wide World of Sports at Walt Disney World in Orlando,





Florida over the Martin Luther King Holiday Weekend, January 15th through the 19th. MSBL/MABL is proud to continue its relationship with Disney's Wide World of Sports. Disney's complex serves as the Spring Training home of the Atlanta Braves.

Per Player Package includes: games at the Disney Complex, all baseball costs, awards, 5 nights accommodations and 3-day Park Hopper Pass (to be used at Animal Kingdom, Epcot, MGM and Magic Kingdom)

The Disney Holiday Classic offers three different age divisions, 18+, 28+ and 38+. In January of this year, the MSBL/MABL hosted the first ever Desert Classic in Palm Springs, California. 




Dallas Blue Stars batter Keith Johnson punches an RBI single up the middle during yesterdays game against Bristol Baseball Club.


Russ Ward scores the go-ahead run for the Bristol Baseball Club in his teams 10-4 win over Dallas in the 38+ National Division.
