#### Rain In The Forecast Causes A Pre-emptive WS Schedule Change By Tom Prendergast

In an effort to try and avoid multiple rainouts later in the week, the MSBL WS staff took the unprecedented step of rescheduling games before the forecasted rains on Tuesday of this week.

All three major networks in the greater Phoenix area have forecasted an 80% or better chance of rain for tonight and all day Tuesday. After conferring with some of the teams (who only had one game scheduled for Monday and two Tuesday) they agreed to play a double-header on Monday and a single game Tuesday. If all the games are rained out on Tuesday then those games will be re-scheduled for Wednesday. (see list on page 2)

Under this scenario teams would not have to play more than two games on any day. And if it doesn't rain then each team will end up playing a 2-2-1-1 pool play schedule. In case of sporadic bad weather please check with your team manager regarding the playing conditions of the fields. The WS staff has all of the team managers' cell phone numbers and we will be in contact with all team managers.

Our goal remains to try and make sure that every team plays all six pool play games, plus playoffs.

MSBL World Series Staff Adds Field Supervisors To Maryvale And Papago Complex By Tom Prendergast

The 18th Annual MSBL World Series got underway yesterday under overcast skies and the watchful eyes of field supervisors at several different complexes yesterday. All thirteen teams played a double-header yesterday. All four of the 28+ National teams and the nine 28+ Continental teams got in two games on Sunday. The Atlanta Astros jumped out to a 2-0 start while three teams in the Continental Division also went 2-0. The Southern California Brewers, Westside Dawgs and Grand Rapid Kosters & Devries won their first two games yesterday.

At the Maryvale and Papago fields, World Series staffers made the rounds and helped keep the games running on time and running smoothly. In an effort to improve communications between the umpires and team managers, briefings were held ahead of time on what was going to be covered in the pre-game plate meetings.

With a watchful eye on the weather, the tournament staff made the unusual decision to reschedule (and move up) some Tuesday games and play those today. All of the teams are scheduled for 6 pool play games in four days, with the playoffs scheduled to be played on Thursday and the Championship games on Friday.



# **Tempe Diablo Complex To Add 4 New Fields For The 2006 Season** *As reported by the Tempe News*

The City of Tempe is spending a minimum of \$20 million dollars on improvements and upgrades to the Tempe Diablo Complex.

As part of an agreement with the California / Los Angeles Angels the City of Tempe is halfway through an eight month renovation project which will add four new baseball fields and be ready in time for Spring Training in March of 2006.

In addition to the new fields, a minor league club house, new batting cages and two new soccer fields will also be built.

These renovations will make Tempe the home of a state-of-the-art baseball facility. All of these new fields will be available for Tempe's youth and amateur sports programs when not being used for spring training. The Angels will cover any cost overruns that exceed \$20 million dollars.

#### 2005 MSBL World Series Office Located At Hohokam Stadium

Hohokam Stadium is located between Brown Road and McKellips Road in north central Mesa. Center Street is located midway between Country Club Drive and Mesa Drive, each of which are easily accessible from the Superstition Freeway (I-60) on the south, and in close proximity to the Red Mountain Freeway (202) on the north (exit at Country Club Drive.) The park is located approximately 10 miles due east of Sky Harbor International Airport, an approximate 20 minute drive. During peak driving times add another 15 minutes. And depending on any area road construction projects the actual amount of time it takes to get to Mesa could increase dramatically. Plan accordingly!
