The Long Island Storm became the first team to win a Rawlings National Championship trophy with an impressive 4-0 victory over the Union 345 Stars. Long Island Storm pitcher Henry Santiago was outstanding, shutting down the explosive 345 Stars hitters and allowing just 6 hits. The Storm hammered out a dozen hits and made several spectacular plays in the field. The Storm won using the same formula that they practiced all week, timely hitting, good defense and great pitching.

In the lowest scoring championship game of the day, the 28+ Wood Bat Chicago Cubs / Reds beat the Peoria Pirates 1-0. Chicago scored the only run of the game on a sacrifice fly and relied on good pitching and defense to keep the Pirates off the board. The Chicago Gators won the 18+ American title game with a 9-3 victory over the Long Island Black Sox. The Las Vegas Dirtbags defeated the Des Moines Vikings 7-1 to win the 18+ Federal Championship trophy. And in the highest scoring championship game of the day, the 18+ Central Puget Sound Scorpions exploded for 7 runs in the first inning in their 13-2 victory over the Denver Wolverines. In addition to some great baseball on the field the weather was just outstanding. A high October sky, with the temperature in the mid 80's helped create the perfect playing weather possible.

Hohokam Stadium is located between Brown Road and McKellips Road in north central Mesa. Center Street is located midway between Country Club Drive and Mesa Drive, each of which are easily accessible from the Superstition Freeway (I-60) on the south, and in close proximity to the Red Mountain Freeway (202) on the north (exit at Country Club Drive.) The park is located approximately 10 miles due east of Sky Harbor International Airport, an approximate 20 minute drive. During peak driving times add another 15 minutes. And depending on any area road construction projects the actual amount of time it takes to get to Mesa could increase dramatically. Please plan accordingly!

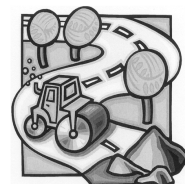

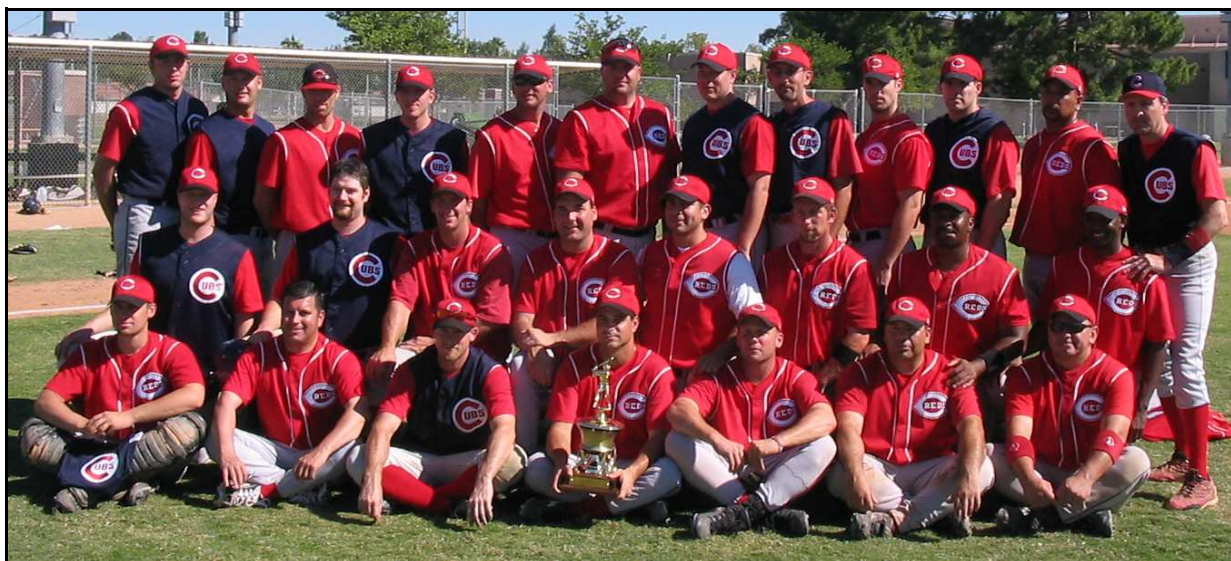
