MSBL National Hall Of Fame Adds Four New Members This Year

MSBL National President Steve Sigler has selected four new MSBL / MABL members for induction into the National Hall of Fame. Roger Stanley (DC Metro), Skip Bradley (San Antonio), Jim Tanner (Terre Haute) and Joe Banasik (Houston).

For the past 16 years, Roger Stanley and his partner Larry Lombardi have directed one of the top MSBL and MABL Leagues in the country. With 91 teams, they oversee one of the largest leagues in the nation. Hard work, long hours and good people have been the secret to their great success. Roger first joined the league as a player and then became a manager and later the next year a director. With a flair for writing software, Roger came up with a patented software program made exclusively for the DC MSBL / MABL. This allows them to maintain a database of over 1500 players, schedule all their games and keep track of payments and league statistics.

Known as a by-the-book task master, Skip Bradley runs a tight ship in San Antonio. Since 1994 he has presided over a league that started with 6 teams and now has 36. The league *(continued on page 3)*

Record Ten World Series Championships Handed Out Record's Complete Their Sweep With Two Titles — 48+ Federal & 58+ American

The final day of the 2005 MSBL World Series ended as it began, under a bright blue sky with temperatures in the mid-eighties. A couple hundred players made their way through the main gates at Papago Park where eight of the ten championship games were played. Both of the team representing Berry's Athletic Supply won championship titles. The 58+ American squad defeated the Sacramento Rivercats, 7-2 after building a commanding 4-0 lead. The 48+ Federal team beat up on the Arkansas Diamonds, 13-2 as the Berry's scored in the first three innings to put the game away early. Without a doubt the Berry's had overwhelming crowd support as most of the spectators at their games were wearing Berry's t-shirts and cheering on their favorite players to victory.

The LA Breakers won the 38+ Continental game 12-5 over the Austin Capitols. In the 38+ Central title game the Rochester Redwings won big over the VABL Dodgers 16 - 3. San Jose defeated the Sacramento Rivercats 14-5 to win the 45+ National Championship trophy while the 55+ LA Athletics shutout the Kansas City Cubs 3-0.

In the 38+ Mountain Championship game the Dream Foundation Padres defeated the So Cal Waves 4-1. The Fresno Bruins won their first MSBL WS title in ten years with a 10-3 victory over the Denver Angels. The DC Cardinals captured the 48+ Central title game with a 11-3 win over the Cinderella team — the Taos Bats. And the first year team of the Detroit 50's won the 58+ Central Championship game over Team America 26-1.






