Great Weather And Good Sportsmanship On Display In Arizona

Tucson Cards Catcher John Reva Gets First Aid By Tri Valley Player Shane Francisco

Another terrific day in the Valley of the Sun as the weather couldn't have been any better. Blue skies and a temperature in the mid-80's gave the players ideal playing conditions. The Valley Mets improved their record to 3-0 with a 17-15 win over the favored Atlanta Astros in the late game at Tempe Diablo Stadium. Grand Rapids Kesters & Devries bounced back from an opening day loss on Sunday to win two games yesterday and grab a share of second place with a 2-1 record. Both the Atlanta Astros and Oklahoma City Braves have two wins and four points.

The Tucson Cardinals (1-1-1) and the Tri Valley Cardinals (1-1-1) played to a 12-12 all tie yesterday after a scary and unusual injury to Tucson catcher, John Reva. With a runner on first trying to steal second, Reva's right arm "popped" and the ball ended up between first and second, as he went down in great pain behind home plate. This is the same type of injury that former Giants Major League pitcher, Dave Dravecky suffered about ten years ago when he broke his humorous bone in mid-delivery.

As soon as he went down, Tri Valley Cardinals catcher, Shane Francisco (a first responder in real life) raced to the plate to help Reva. He stayed with him until the Tempe Paramedics arrived and took him off the field on a stretcher. During this time players from both teams huddled around the plate while the paramedics worked on the injured Tucson catcher. After about twenty minutes, he was placed on a stretcher and taken to the hospital. At the time the Tucson Cardinals were batting their entire roster, and Tri Valley was (continued on page 2)

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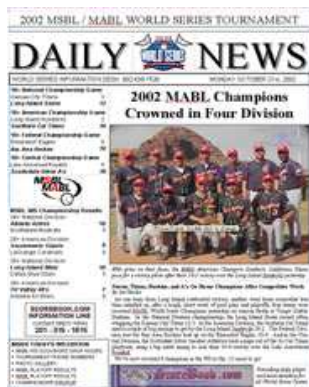

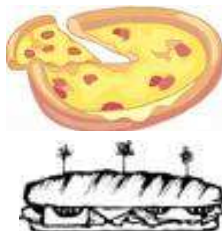

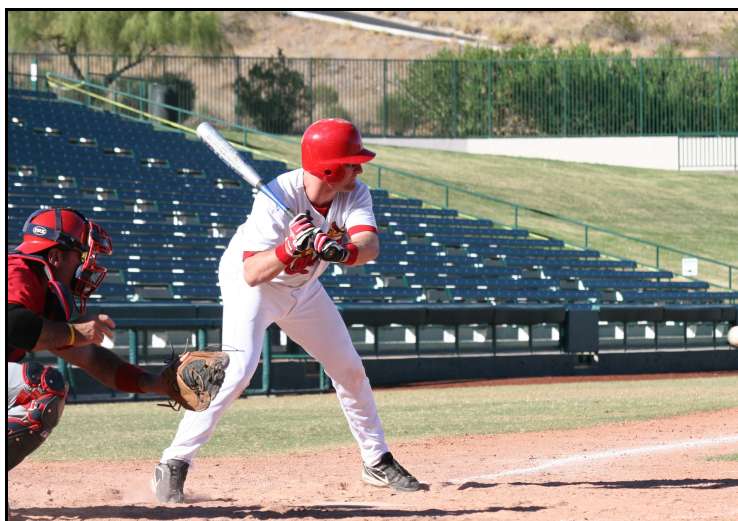
