Eleven MSBL Champions Crowned On Last Day Of The 2006 World Series Ft Wayne Co-Founder, Jim Shovlin Inducted Into MSBL National Hall Of Fame By Tom Prendergast

The great weather continued Saturday on the final day of the 2006 MSBL / MABL World Series in Tempe, Arizona. Eleven teams completed their seasons with a championship game win and a World Series title. The Tucson A's / White Sox defeated the South Dakota 40's, 3-1 in the 38+ Continental game. In the 38+ Central contest the Twin City Twins beat the Komax Masters 12-1. The Detroit 50's made their home town proud with an exciting 9-7 win over the San Antonio Rangers to capture the 58+ National trophy. In the 45+ National Championship game the San Antonio Bombers beat the San Jose All-Stars 8-1. The 48+ Federal Berry's Athletic Supply team held on for a 5-4 win over the Rhode Island Salty Dogs. The 48+ Mountain Fresno Phillies scored the most runs of any team with a 21-18 championship game win over the Chicago Fire, in ten innings. The Austin Express beat the Chicago N. Lookouts 12-7 in the 48+ Central championship game.

At Tempe Diablo Stadium in the 55+ National Championship game, the LA Athletics scored two runs in the bottom of the ninth for an incredibly exciting, 7-6, come-from behind win over the Kansas City Cubs. In the days quickest game (2 hours and 10 minutes) the 38+ Mountain San Antonio Missions beat the Oklahoma City Sox 5-1 (continued on page 3)


