

Storybook Ending After 20 Years For The 55+ Central Hollywood Stars MSBL WS Championship Day Includes Plenty Of Drama And Exciting Finishes By Tom Prendergast

The 2007 MSBL / MABL World Series saved the best for last. After twenty years of futility the Hollywood Stars finally won an MSBL World Series championship. Tied 2-2 with the Washington Senators, the Stars scored a run in the top of the ninth and then held on for an exciting 3-2 win, to capture the 55+ Central division championship trophy. The Long Island Mets returned to the winners circle with an impressive 19-3 win over San Jose in the 45+ National championship. The South Dakota Rushmores defeated Team USA 9-7 to take home the 35+ Continental championship title.

In the competitive 55+ National division championship game the Kansas City Cubs knocked off the defending champs, the LA Athletics 10-0. The 45+ Mountain Fresno Phillies made it two in a row winning a pitcher's duel 2-1 over the Houston Yankees. In the day's highest scoring game the 35+ Cascade Mariners beat the Maryland Orioles 14-10 to win the trophy in the 35+ Mountain division. The Puget Sound Gators capped off a great week with an exciting 7-6 come-from-behind win over the Utah Black Sox to win the 35+ Central championship.

The Paladin 55's won the American championship trophy with a 3-1 win over the Fresno Grizzlies in a very well played defensive game. In the final championship game of the day the San Antonio Red Sox defeated Salt Lake City Empire 5-2 to win the 45+ Central division title on Tempe field # 4.

Our twentieth year was definitely one of the best ever. The weather was perfect, competition was very competitive, and lots of friendships were renewed during the three week tournament in Arizona. The "live" webcast was well received as the MSBL / MABL World Series ended it's second decade and paved the way to move into the next one.










