Probably 12-15 times these two clubs have met, often with the division championship on the line. The mutual respect and shared sense of great games always makes Noah proclaim that he doesn't see how it could be any better. Clark's team won a championship in the MSBL Fall Classic with the 52+ National Division. Tony LaGreca took Noah to San Juan last February for the Caribbean Winter Baseball Classic, and he got to experience playing on Latin stadiums and more high quality baseball. Noah has managed several age divisions, including 22+, 32+, 42+, and 50+. His teams have won 15 local league championships, and he was inducted into the RIMSBL Hall of Fame in 1999. Max Reising (Chicago 45+)

You can depend on it. If you want to know about MSBL in Chicago, ask Max Reising. He's been I nvolved with it since 1990. As a member of Bart Zeller's Chicago North Cubs team that year, he experienced what the big league Cubs did. Fly to Arizona and play ball when it's cold up north. Use

major league fields, wear major league uniforms, eat out at local hot spots, live the life of a pro. By 1992, Max was co-manager with John Salingo (a fellow MSBL Hall of Fame member). John later moved to Phoenix, like so many of the MLB players do, and have been regulars every year at the World Series. Taking teams through the Central, Continental, Father & Son, and American Divisions has been a rewarding experience for them. Max took over the TSP Cubs in the second year of F/S play, and today he manages the TSP Loockouts. His teams over the years have made many quarter finals and 3 or 4 appearances in the semi-finals. Winning a championship is still a goal, but playing great baseball with great friends is really the big attraction. Max has played with his son or a nephew from Mesa in Father/Son every year since 1996. His professional career has been involved with baseball as well. Along with fellow MSBL member Bruce Zimmerman, Max runs Team Sport Pro, and institutional sporting goods dealership. In Chicago, he has served the CNMSBL as a player/manager, the League Personnel Director, Scheduler, and currently is the League President. Occasionally playing on 25+ and 55+ teams, he mainly concentrates of the 35+ and 45+ teams he manages. No keeping this guy still; if they're playing baseball, you can be sure Max is somehow involved. His most unusual WS event occurred in 1992 when his team won a DH at old Sun City Stadium and headed back on I-17 in a caravan of five cars. A reckless driver racing at 95mph caused their van to spin around and flip over, totaling the vehicle. All players survived, but were thankful just be alive and together. Inducted into the MSBL Hall of Fame in 2007, Max has proven to worthy of many honors from his teammates, his league, and the national organization. You can depend on him.



Father & Son American Maine Diamond Dogs defeated The Athletics 5-2 during yesterday's championship game played at Tempe Diablo Stadium.




65+ National Chicago Skyliners won the championship game in convincing manner with a 5-0 white wash of the Detroit 65's Sunday morning at Salt River Stadium.
