# **Tournament Staff Clarifies Participation Rule For Central and Cactus Divisions**

Several protests in week one convinced the WS tournament staff that the current rule (as listed in the official scorebook) was poorly written and confusing. On two occasions last week I used the newsletter to try and explain the intent of the rule. I think it's safe to say that I was not successful, and in fact, I only added to the confusion. Under Central & Cactus Division Requirements, paragraph A reads as follows: At least 14 uniformed players must have at least one plate appearance during the game. (only applies in 9 inning games). Well what if the game doesn't go the full nine innings because of the time limit? Up until this year, this rule always implied to "scheduled" 9 inning games. Because the written rule doesn't specify this, it simply states that - this rules only applies to 9 inning games. Effective immediately; teams in the Central and Cactus divisions only need to get a plate appearance for 14 batters if the game goes the full nine innings.

# The Way We Were! 1988 - 1990 MSBL World Series

My introduction to the MSBL World Series was as a player - manager the first two years. I still get goose pumps just thinking about it. Our team flew into Phoenix and went right to our hotel, where we quickly changed into our KC Royals uniforms and headed out to Scottsdale Community College to practice. That night I attended the mandatory managers meeting held in the Buttes amphitheater. The room was packed. A stoic MSBL founder, Steve Sigler came to the podium and went over the rules and answered questions for what seemed like hours. I vaguely remember a lot of questions about something called "the courtesy runner rule". The next day we played our first game at the spring training home of the Milwaukee Brewers, Compadre Stadium and then headed to Apache Junction HS for our second game. Each field was better than the next. We ended the week 0-6 (and the same thing happened the next year) but we got a taste of playing baseball in an incredible atmosphere, and we were hooked. Like many other managers, I encountered some bad calls by umpires, teams with no first names on their lineup cards, and some guys didn't even have matching uniforms. And I remember thinking that we were spending a lot of money to play. Sometimes we would get to a field and the gates were locked, or the sprinklers would come on and occasionally the lights wouldn't work. After the game we would call our score into the office, where tournament director, Kurt Knop would answer the phone and take our score. If we wanted to get the standings we would head over to Tempe Diablo Stadium and visit the novelty shop, where the divisions were posted on the walls. The next morning, game recap sheets with all the scores and standings were delivered to our hotel and we would study them during breakfast. And when we weren't playing we were usually scouting our opponents, who were playing on another field. What was important to me then was that I was playing competitive baseball, in an organized event (continued on page 4)

(continued from page 3) with guys my own age. There was really nothing like this and I felt extremely fortunate to be a part of it. I still feel that way today, as the tournament director. Through the years we have made a lot of improvements to the event. The amount of planning takes months and scheduling 300 teams is way more time consuming than 38. As with any kind of business that's been around for 27 years, we have made adjustments. Like adding divisions, age groups and expanding the event from one week to three. By being proactive and taking these steps we have kept the tournament competitive for all levels. To me it's a great compliment that we attract as many former professional players as we do. In order to allow those guys to play, we came up with some different criteria's, which worked well in the beginning, but probably needs some tweaking. OK maybe a lot of tweaking. The purpose of the original Central division was to establish a place, that would ensure all levels of players would be able to compete, which would include players with like skills. I don't think our current system is accomplishing this goal. It's our intention to take a long look at the process we have and to make it better by returning to the original concept and have it in place for next years event.
