WS Hall of Fame Inductee

Darrell Creel resides in Albuquerque, New Mexico and plays in the MABL/MSBL of the same name. He has been attending the MSBL World Series as a player and manager since 1989 and for his support and passion for the MSBL banner he has been inducted into the 2016 class of the MSBL World Series Hall of Fame. He and his wife Paula were busy packing up the gear after a game at the stadium when I caught up with them.

"I have been coming to Arizona since 1989 and have only missed one year and that was because I had cancer surgery," explained Creel. "I still wanted to come before the surgery but they wouldn't let me. But I have made all of the others."

Darrell and Paula are a part of the Cyclones of the 25-over division back in Albuquerque. They are also the Cyclones when they come to Arizona. "We went from MSBL to MABL back home four years ago because some of our older guys were retiring so we had a sort of youth movement," said Darrell. "We have won the division two of the four years and are very proud of that."

The 25-over division at the World Series in Arizona is equally as tough as back home. "We won a ring last year (2015) against our old nemesis the Twin City Cardinals so we are hoping for a repeat. We have been coming down as the Cyclones for six years and have made the semi-finals for four of those years and then the finals, of course, last year." (continued on page 3)

60+ Cactus Division, Inland Angels 7, Puget Sound Mariners 4

Rick McGauhey pitched a complete game for the Angels and struck out two in a 7-4 win over the Mariners Saturday, November 5th. Kevin Olds took the loss for the Mariners, striking out five Puget Sound hitters and walking three. Inland's Steve Pulbrook went 2 for 4 with two hits, including a double and three RBIs while Wayne Newcomb went 2 for 3 with two singles.

60+ Mountain Division, DFW Phillies 7, Sacramento Tribe 6

Gary Firestone lined a two out double to right field driving in two runs to stake the Phillies to a one run lead in the eighth inning and they would hang on to win the 60 Mountain Division championship. Firestone went two for four on the day driving in four runs. Antone Henley also had a strong day for the Phillies going two for three at the plate and scoring three runs.

45+ Cactus 'Ring' Division, Lehigh Valley Hurricanes 16, Ventura Dodgers 10

The Hurricanes exploded for six runs in the eighth and one more in the ninth to take the wind out of the Dodgers. Roman Dasco was named MVP by manager Steve Smull for going four for five with a walk and scoring five times. The Hurricanes were behind 10-9 before the eruption in the eighth inning. Pitcher Phil Torcivia got the victory in relief.

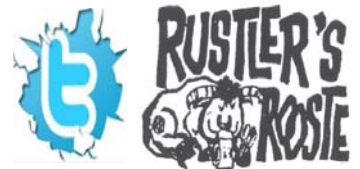

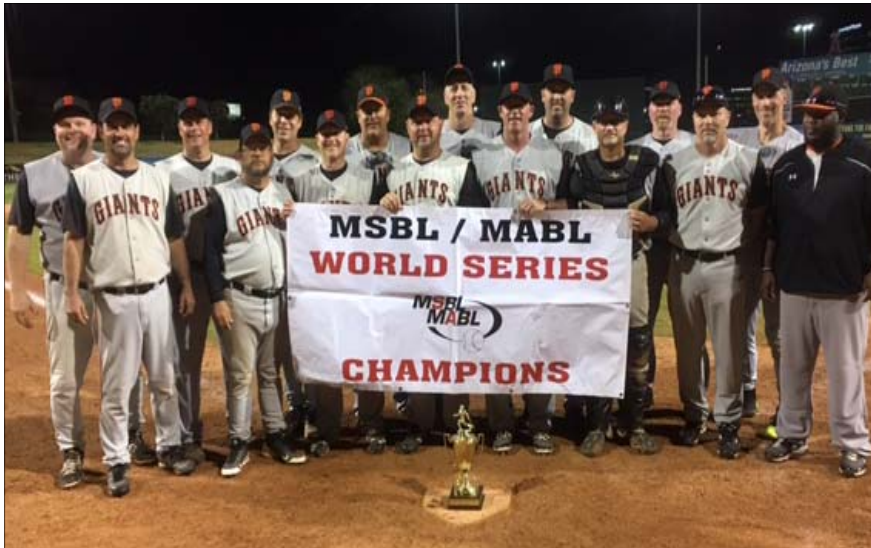

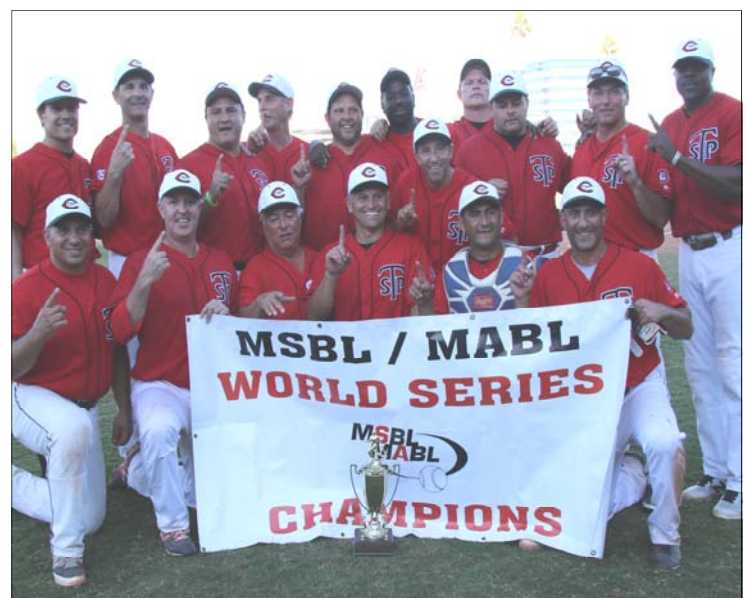
