Behind The Scenes At The 2016 MSBL / MABL World Series



Planning for the 2016 MSBL / MABL World Series started a few weeks after the 2015 MSBL / MABL WS tournament. The national office secures fields, sends out a myriad of correspondence to all prospective team managers, hotels, vendors and retailers that provide the many services that the WS tournament relies on each year. This can be a daunting and very time consuming task. In addition we have to secure approximately 150 umpires to work more than 1100 games during the three week event. The schedule process alone takes more than a month to complete. And that's just the work that goes into this event before it begins. Once we get started playing games, the WS office staff takes over and handles all areas of the event including receiving and posting game scores as well as being the communication hub of the tournament. Updating the website, our Facebook page, and our Twitter account is an on going process. In addition to that each day we publish the WS Daily News, with the previous days scores and standings along with any pertinent news about what else is going on at the tournament. On any given day, we will play between 80 and 100 games which generally begin as early as 8:30am and the last game ends around 11:00pm. So on a typical day the office opens at 7:00am and closes after midnight.

If you spent a day in the WS office you'd get a pretty good feel for what's going with the tournament as well as learn some very interesting (and at times) controversial information about the some of the teams and participants. For example, approximately every third phone call has do to with either, the courtesy runner, A/B batter protocol, the shared position, and of course, individual player exemptions. Add rain into the mix and the phones light up!

The main job of the WS staff is to keep the tournament running smoothly and without interruption. Teams come to Arizona to play baseball - that's the mission. Everything else is secondary to that goal. Protests, special MSBL rules (including Central and Cactus participation requirements), umpire egos and teams in the wrong dugout are all issues that we hear about on a regular basis. But at the end of the day, if all the games get played, then we are doing our job!

25+ National, AZ - SoCal Snappers 2, Lake Hefner Pelicans 0

Pete Hartmann threw a two-hit, complete-game shutout for the Snappers as the left-hander struck out four and walked one in guiding the SoCal Snappers to the 25 National title at HoHoKam Stadium. The 46-year-old kept the Pelicans off balance all game as top-seeded Lake Hefner only managed a double by Dave Newell and a single by John Tointigh. The Snappers plated two runs in the sixth off Pelican starter Brett Case when Zak Qualls and Scott Hanish opened the frame with singles and scored on a sacrifice fly and fielder's choice.

25+ Mountain, Arizona Smoke 6, LA Bandits 3

The Arizona Smoke redeemed themselves after losing to the Bandits in the championship last year. The Smoke were led by starting pitcher Garcia who pitched nine complete innings, only allowing three runs in the seventh inning. At the time, it was 4-0 and the Bandits had a close attempt for a comeback before the Smoke added three additional runs in the top of the ninth inning.

25+ Central 'Ring' Division, Colorado Rippers 9, MSL Chicago 1

The Rippers claimed their first MSBL Championship thanks to a 6-run first inning and a complete game pitching performance from Ross MacDonald at the Maryvale Baseball Complex. Eric Payan and Robert Williams had two hits apiece for the Rippers while catcher Rich Miller capped off the first inning scoring with a 2-run double as nine different players scored a run. MacDonald yielded just five hits and an unearned run, not allowing a runner past second base after the first inning. Paul Palera had a pair of hits for MSL Chicago, while Josh Kwansy pitched 4 1/3 innings of relief, retiring the first 13 batters he faced. (continued on page 3)

THE ZONE OF TEMPORAL DISTORTION






