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MSBL WS Iron Man - 30 year Attendee - Pat Carroll

Pat Carroll customarily plays two weeks in the MSBL World Series and this year is no different, as he is playing with the Tri-Valley Giants in the Father/Son division in week two and with the Dragons in the 60 division in week three. He played in the very first MSBL World Series in 1988 with his buddy Ray Allen. He hasn't missed one yet.



"In 1988 we played for the Bay Area team in the 30+ division and it started the string. I'm now 61 years old and wouldn't dare go back to the 30+ division!"

Pat is still playing all over the field, as he is a pitcher and also plays first base along with stints at second and third. During the regular season he can be seen playing for the 50+ Giants in the Bay Area MSBL and for the 55+ Expos in the Tri-Valley MSBL. "I have been playing in the Bay Area MSBL since 1988 and Tri-Valley since 2012. I love the game!"

Special moments seem to come easily to Pat. "In 1991 or 1992 when our Bay Area team had a very small roster, maybe 12 guys, somehow we made it into the playoffs. After winning one playoff game we met up with a team from Atlanta that had 25-30 guys, all seemingly fresh. Although everyone on our team was exhausted from playing so many games shorthanded, we battled hard and lost a close game, something like 13-12. I believe the Atlanta team went on to win the Championship. It was truly a special experience playing with such great people all week long. The camaraderie was unbelievable, easily one of the best in my 29 years of playing in the World Series."

Pat continued his trip down memory lane. "In our 20th consecutive year playing in the World Series, Rob Goldstein, Ray Allen and I finally got our first rings when we joined up with a strong Dragons team managed by Allan Green. With this team we would go on to repeat in 2008 and then win it again in 2009 in the Florida Fall Classic. Three rings in a row! The 20 year wait was well worth it and we'll always be (continued on page 3)

Las Vegas trailed most of the game as Utah scored two in the first inning, including an RBI double by Carson Angerth, and eventually led 5-2 after three innings. Las Vegas tied it in the fourth on a Vukasin double. Utah, which won four in a row to get the title game and went 4-2 on the week with both losses coming against Las Vegas, went ahead in the seventh by a two-run double by Duane Lee.

Father/Son-Federal: So Cal Quakes 6, Team Mexico 5

With two outs and nobody on the Quakes rallied in the bottom of the ninth to tie the game on a Ken Henry RBI single and Frank Annunziato drove in the winning run in the 11th to secure the Quakes' third Father/Son title. 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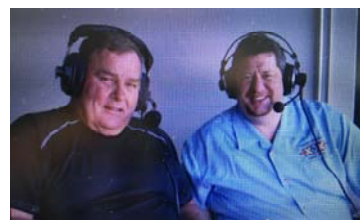

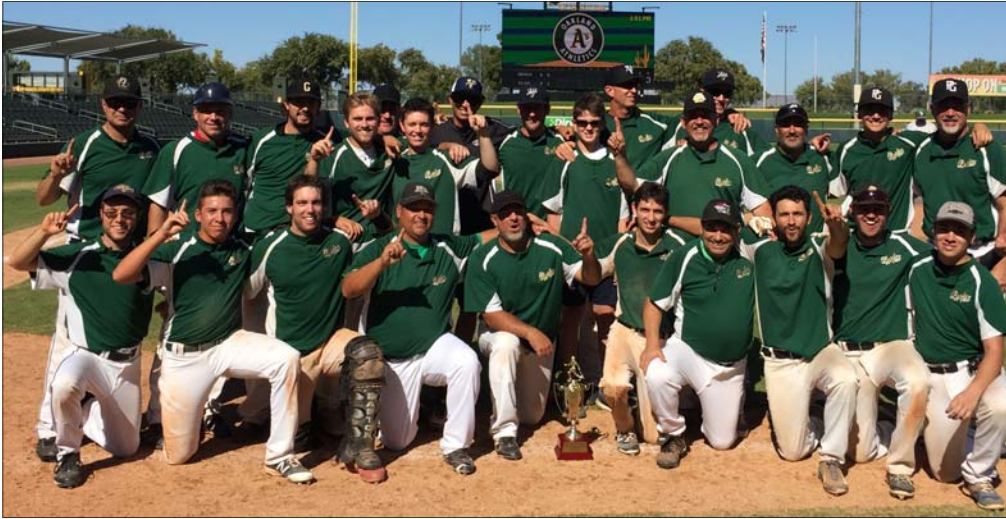
Father/Son-Cactus: Waikiki Beach Boys 29, Denver Grizzlies 14

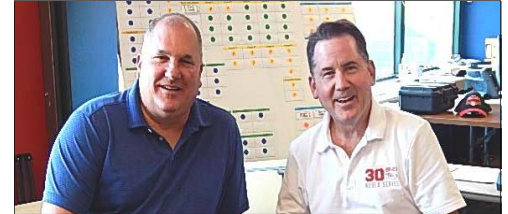
