I've played 20 years in the MSBL, starting at the age of 19. I was contacted by a manager via AOL messenger who had found my profile online. I had listed one my interests as baseball, and he invited me to a tryout for a new 18+ team he was putting together in the Chicago area for the 1999 season. Tempe #1 - Starter Justin Bell, his father, Jeff Bell, and Trent Lewis, who pitched the ninth, scattered 14 hits as the Ranch Blue Dogs beat the Utah Yutes 7-5 in the Father/Son Zona championship in the 32nd MSBL World Series in Tempe. The Blue Dogs, back-to-back champions over the Yutes, scored five in the first and two in the fourth. Josh Bell, who caught all nine innings, was 2-4, while Craig Lewis was 2-3. Zac Pivett, the starting shortstop and lead-off hitter for Utah, was 4-5. He also struck out eight of his 13 batters and shut out the Blue Dogs over the final four innings.

Father/Son Federal - Maine Diamond Dogs 5, Mexico 3

Hohokam Stadium, Mesa, AZ - Maine's top of the order has carried the load on offense all tournament and today was no different. Sons Matt Powers and Ryan Dimascio scored four of the five runs for Maine leading them to a 5-2 victory over Mexico in the Father/Son Federal Championship on Sunday morning at Hohokam. service called Throw Again, which is a lifealtering baseball training and injury recovery program aimed to help players of all ages throw with comfort, durability, and longevity at maximal levels of performance. I've worked with players at all levels – professional, college, and amateur - managing all aspects of postsurgery recovery, injury rehabilitation, and performance. I have been married for six years to my wife Kate and we have two girls – Josephine (age 2) and Lucy (age 1). Winning the 2008 World Series as a first-time manager definitely ranks high on the list, but my most memorable moment was at the World Series in 2012. My fiancée Kate was playing on another local MSBL team at the time, and we were scheduled to play each other in a pool play game at Fitch Park. I happened to be starting that game on the mound, and knew it was a possibility that I would face Kate at some point in the game. When the opportunity presented itself and Kate was walking up to the box, I recall a strange silence – it was as if the games at the neighboring fields were on pause to watch the at-bat. I immediately went down 2-0, and remember thinking - there is no way I can walk her! Next pitch, I fired a fastball dead in the zone and she ripped a line drive base hit right over my head. Everyone went nuts and she had the biggest smile on her face as she rounded first base. The MSBL has impacted my life tremendously. After twice being cut from my high school team, having the opportunity to continue playing baseball at a completive level inspires me every day to maximize myself and prove that age and talent level are not a barrier to play this game. After 20 years of struggling and working to better myself, I finally won the league's Cy Young award at 40 years old. I am not one for awards, but this accomplishment carries special meaning to me after never getting the opportunity (continued on page 3)




