

Jay Ciambrone 35-year World Series Attendee

"Our So Cal Fire teams were competing in six tournaments per year at one time," explained the World Series veteran. "We also played in the league so we asked for quite a commitment from our players. Our successes came from a lot of hard work and dedication."


Jay moved to California from Detroit in 1980 and wanted to get back into baseball again. So Cal was just starting up a few years later and he jumped right in and also became a board member.

"I was on the board maybe the first five years but not anymore. We started as the So Cal Yankees at the MSBL World Series in 1988. I remember playing San Jose that first year and we both had some ex-pro members and it looked like an 'A' pro game. It was very exciting to be a part of. I was hooked and never missed again."

Jay's championship closet is full of rings. He owns five as a manger/player and a few years back decided to just play and not deal with the managerial duties. He explained that his focus was always to make sure everyone got playing time. Part of his decision to stop coaching was because of the difficulties of both managing and playing.

"This year I will be a part of Ted Poleto's Inland Angels in the 65s. I turned over the reins on the 60s and 65s a few years ago and the 65s have now turned into the 70-over Pacific Reds and the 60s have disbanded. The Reds players are from all over the place. Our So Cal Fire teams were mostly local. It's a new role to (continued on page 2)

be a manager. I'll be assisting him with some of the duties so I guess you can call me a co-manager."

What are some of your fondest memories of the World Series?

"Our 2005 team was a blast. It was a fun group, a lot of guys, but we showed our philosophy can work: Don't be the type of team that picks on guys, or is negative, because everybody has their abilities and everyone can contribute. We were successful in the round-robin that year and were up 10-1 in the quarter-finals and narrowly survived that game, 10-9 then we won 7-3 in the semis.

Then in the championship game, we went 13 innings. The other pitcher threw all 13 innings and their shortstop kept them in the game. But in the bottom of the 13th inning, they had used every guy in the game. We had a guy on second with one out and the guy took off to third but it caused the shortstop to hesitate and he threw it away at first and the guy came around and scored. We won 4-3. Our So Cal Yankees won the 48+ American championship!"

What is the craziest thing you have seen while playing in Arizona?

"We were playing the Phillies in the 2009 championship game at Tempe Diablo #3. We were in the bottom of the ninth and they had their last at bats and we were up 2-1. They hit a grounder to short with a guy on first and we got the guy at second but didn't throw to first but the ump called their runner for an illegal slide and we won the championship on an illegal slide. That's a tough loss.




