2024 MSBL World Series HOF Recipient Brian Carroll, Arkansas Diamonds

Brian Carroll is 69 years old and lives in North Little Rock, AR and is affiliated with the Central Arkansas MSBL, where he has been suiting up since 1998. "I'm not too active in the league right now but I



have many great memories of playing," said Brian. "We only have one division there and I was a catcher and infielder." Brian is also one of the main architects of the Arkansas Diamonds, a perennial contender every year at the MSBL World Series. It is a successful team that he co-manages with fellow Hall of Fame member John Godfrey. Because of Brian's involvement in the World Series for so many years, MSBL Founder & President Steve Sigler has inducted Brian into the 2024 class of the MSBL World Series Hall of Fame. "MSBL has provided an avenue for thousands of men to continue to play baseball at their level of competence for many years, and I hope many more years. This award represents an acknowledgement of an effort to keep my buddies playing. It is very gratifying to be recognized." Brian is retired from the field of construction and facilities management while being married to his wonderful wife, Dawne, for 46 years and together their son Ted, daughter Micah, daughter Cate, and son Clay. No matter what age, guys still want to win, period! There's no denying this and I think it's been pretty apparent throughout the first two weeks of this tournament. So it's not really surprising that in our 75+ division, players are testing the limits on the special rules, which we use in that age group. At the top of the list is, no stealing. But it's OK to take a lead off. Several players have interpreted that as - it's alright to get as close to second base as you can, without actually stepping on the bag. Seems like that's stretching common sense just a bit, but in order to clarify a lead off, the WS staff has added the words, a two-step lead off. After head to head play, the first tie breaker is the number of runs a team allows. After every game both the home team and the visiting team are required to call or text the score in to the WS office. As a backup, the umpires are also required to report the score as well. That means that for every game we should be getting 3 score reports. You'd be amazed at just how many times we receive 3 different scores. As always, the home teams book carry's the day and it's the official book for the game. Bottom line, always check your runs allowed every day!

On a occasion, a player will disagree with an umpires call and say or do the wrong thing.

On a occasion, a player will disagree with an umpires call and say or do the wrong thing, which usually leads to an ejection. Now the MSBL isn't the boy scouts and even though cooler heads normally prevail, some times the situation can get a bit tense. When a player does receive an ejection it's for that game only. It doesn't carry over to the next game. Unless the player threatens the umpire ("hey will finish this in the parking lot"), then he's in time out and has to go to the principles office. But if it's just an ejection, the player has to leave the dugout, but can remain in the stands, providing he doesn't do anymore heckling or berating of the umpires. If that happens then the player will be asked to leave the park premises.

class of the MSBL National Hall of Fame. As anticipated, Joe was quick to deflect any individual recognition. "I personally hate individual accolades, especially when they are applied to me, but I am proud to represent the Jacksonville MABL and wish for our league to have continued success," Joe explained.

The 42-year-old Hellett is still able to find some time to step between the lines, though it becomes increasingly more difficult because of time constraints. "I play for the 18+ Jacksonville Indians in our league. I used to play third base but am now primarily a DH and a fill-in outfielder. My brother Devon is our shortstop and bats cleanup for us." Joe is also a veteran of MSBL tournament play. "I have played in the MSBL Fall Classic multiple times, as well as the Rosie Shootout in Atlanta from 2010-2014, the Holiday Classic in Sanford, and the first Sunshine Classic held in Panama City Beach in 2021. I will be playing/coaching the Jacksonville Hops 18+ team in the upcoming Fall Classic, and looking forward to beginning a 35+ team soon from Jacksonville." Joe is a high school social studies teach and, you guessed it, their baseball coach. Running the league, while also grading papers and coaching others, takes a lot of discipline. We asked Joe who some of the individuals were who drove home that discipline in his journey to this point in his life. "The list is too long to list, but spiritually I would like to highlight Wayne Boyd from my hometown, who passed away in 2007. His infectious love for the game at every level motivated me to seek out continuing to play after high school and led me to finding Dexter Littlefield's Brewers in the classified ads of the local paper. I also want to thank our league's board members Danny Haynes, Dennis Shannon, Chris Haynes, and Bill Klein, as the league could not exist without them."

Any special highlights from your league or tournament participation? "The biggest highlight would be winning our 10th league championship as a team this past season. Our league is very competitive with multiple talented teams, so winning a championship is very difficult to achieve. I celebrate every one of them, but winning the 10th was the most difficult yet. The bottom line that means so much to me is that I respect any player who steps onto the field to compete and enjoy the love of the game. I hope to continue to play until I am eligible for the oldest available MSBL tournament bracket." Well, Joe, 2024 marks the inauguration of our 80-over division at this year's MSBL World Series in Arizona. That gives you 38 more years to get ready. We'll be waiting for you!
